Pastor's Paragraph

"Come to me, all you who are struggling hard and carrying heavy loads and I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28 (CEB)

Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? You aren't alone. That's what Jesus asked people as he traveled from city to city. He saw a lot of people who were worn out – physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually. That was true then and it's true today, too.

Jesus was talking to people who were looking for a quick fix, but finding no help. The latest miracle drug? Sign me up. The most popular diet? God the app. The best guide to parenting? Send it to me now. The new trend in worship? We'll try it.

We're always looking for ways to reclaim our energy, our passion, our looks, our love. That's because what we have seems stale, outdated, the same ol', same ol'. So we turn away from what we know to try out new things. Only to find they don't work or they grow old as well. Then it's on to the next thing...and the next...and the cycle continues.

If that sounds like your life, I invite you to listen to or, better yet, read Jesus' words in Matthew 11. People were coming to see him because they wanted to see miracles. They wanted the show. They wanted the next, big thing. They missed the point.

Jesus was offering an old thing, in a new way. He was reminding them that real life begins, continues and ends with love, God's love. The God who goes before us, who is with us and who sustains us loves us more than we could possibly imagine, to depths we will never plumb.

All we have to do is accept our role. God is God. We are not. Jesus invites us to walk with him, to watch him at work, to learn the rhythms of grace. Nothing heavy. Nothing that won't fit. Connect to Jesus and you'll learn to live freely and lightly.

Corona UMW Book Readers Club

For our October and November gatherings we discussed The Book of Joy written by Douglas Abrams after spending time with His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

This book is the result of discussions/interviews with two spiritual giants over five days. The emphasis was on the question of Joy.

Nobel Peace Prize Laureates His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu have survived more than fifty years of exile and the soul-crushing violence of oppression. Despite their hardships, or, as they would say, because of them, they are two of the most joyful people on the planet.

In April 2015, Archbishop Tutu traveled to the Dalai Lama's home in Dharamsala, India, to celebrate His Holiness' eightieth birthday and to create what they hoped would be a gift for others. They looked back on their long lives to answer a single burning question: How do we find joy in the face of life's inevitable suffering?

They traded intimate stories, teased each other continually, and shared their spiritual practices. By the end of a week filled with laughter and punctuated with tears, these two global heroes had stared into the abyss and despair of our times and revealed how to live a life brimming with joy.

This book offers us a rare opportunity to experience their astonishing and unprecedented week together, from the first embrace to the final good-bye. We get to listen in as they explore the *Nature of True Joy* and confront each of the *Obstacles to Joy*. They offer us the *Eight Pillars of Joy*. And they share the daily *Joy Practices* that anchor their own emotional and spiritual lives.

The Archbishop has never claimed sainthood, and the Dalai Lama considers himself a simple monk. In this unique collaboration, they offer us the reflection of real lives filled with pain and turmoil in the midst of which they have been able to discover a level of peace, of courage, and of joy to which we can all aspire in our own lives.

There are many books available in the church library; this is just one of them. I hope you will check out the selection of books in the narthex and inside the church office and decide to check one out for your reading pleasure.
