Pastor's Paragraph

Jesus said, *“Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it.”* Luke 9:23-24

Beloved,

The season of Lent (February 17-April 3) is a time for self-reflection and deepening one's relationship with God in Jesus Christ. For many the season leading up to Easter means giving up something they enjoy as a sign of contrition for the wrong they have done. Others will spend extra time in devotions and prayer, while a few more will carry a cross or nail in their pocket as a reminder of the sacrifice Jesus made for them and the whole world. If you want some great Daniel Fast recipes, ask Esperanza.

If those practices work for you, wonderful! Others may want to find different ways of observing this holy season. Here are a few ideas:

- Apologize to someone – Lent is a season of repentance and forgiveness. What better way to reconciliation? (Matthew 5:23-24)
- Do random acts of kindness – express your love for Jesus by loving others. Even better, do so and then spend time with the person. (Mark 12:30-31)
- Serve someone in need – volunteer your time to a charitable organization or help your neighbors during the season. (John 13:1-17)
- Read a book of the Bible – enhance your meditation and spiritual journey by letting the Spirit of God speak to your heart. (Hebrew 4:12)
- Say “thank you” – many people helped shape you into the wonderful person you are. Send a note of gratitude to one each week. (Colossians 3:16-17)
- Call a lonely person – Jesus taught his disciples to care for others (Matthew 25:31-36). Call and then just listen. Being present makes all the difference in a person's day and life!

We will be offering a 5-part Lenten series “Homemade Soup & the Soul” via ZOOM on Wednesdays during Lent. We'll share homemade soup recipes and eat together, talk about our experiences of God and use scripture to learn more about how our soul is made better by Jesus. Check out the information later in this issue.

May the peace of God and the blessing of the Holy Spirit fill you each day during this time of reflection and spiritual travel.
