Measuring the impact of UMW groups at Corona UMC for 1 year May 2018 to May 2019

Corona UMW

- In 2018 donated \$3,280 to United Methodist Missions for women, children and youth worldwide
- Gave \$260 to David & Margaret Home and \$200 to Methodist Hospital

UMW Faith in Motion

- ✓ 1200 diapers and 650 baby wipes were donated for a Corona family of a disabled mother with 4 children under 4 years old.
- ✓ 3 days of motel vouchers for an evicted Corona family of 6.
- ✓ Christmas gifts of clothing and shoes given for 3 children in poverty referred by Raney Intermediate School Community Liaison
- ✓ “Adopted” 2 teachers at Raney Intermediate School, where **71%** of students are socioeconomically disadvantaged.
- ✓ 240 bottles of water and 840 granola bars donated for nutrition for AVID class (110 students and Academic Literacy Class (44 students who read below grade level)
- ✓ 2 I Pads donated to use for a special learning program for the Academic Literacy class
- ✓ 15 subscriptions for SCOPE magazine donated for kids in Academic Literacy
- ✓ Laurie Goodhue tutored a student from the Academic Literacy class over several months whose grades have changed from F’s to C’s
- ✓ 110 two inch binders with dividers were provided for the AVID class
- ✓ All was accomplished with the generosity and countless volunteer hours by Faith in Motion women.

UMW Seams of Faith

- 30 baby blankets made and donated to new mothers at Corona Life
- 30 Prayer quilts made and given to the ill or bereaved of the congregation
- 17 Quilts of Valor made for veterans at a local nursing home
- 12 aprons, 10 table runners, and numerous small items made for the Holiday Bazaar to raise money for UMC Missions.
- Countless volunteer hours were given to sew these items

UMW Book Club

- 12 women have read and discussed 10 books on spiritual or personal growth.
- Accumulated books were donated to the church library for anyone to borrow
- 22 different people have signed out library books and read from 1 to 10 books each

UMW Bad Girls of the Bible

- 20 women meet monthly in the evening to study and discuss spiritual and personal growth
- 5 women participating in the group do not attend our church

UMW Faith Journey

- 12 - 14 women meet every week to enjoy building a community of faith on the journey of life.
- 2 women participating in the group do not attend our church.
- 3 women have joined the group shortly after their first visit of our church

STEP - Sisters Together Envisioning Peace

- Women enjoy programs of interest, get to know each other as friends, and share a meal.
- 15 women from Corona UMC meet with 20 or more women from other churches and other faiths, including Episcopalian, Catholic, LDS, Jewish Temple, Muslim Mosque, and others.
