Easter - a Season, Not Just a Sunday

You might have noticed on Easter Sunday different colors, flowers, adornments and liturgical objects on the chancel (what some call the "stage" - though worship is not a performance). The lilies went home with new friends after Easter Sunday, but the rest of these items will remain for what's known as the SEASON of Easter.

Easter Sunday marks the end of the season of Lent (40 days, not including Sundays since they are "Little Easters"). I was privileged to attend the Ramadan Interfaith Iftar & Dinner at the Islamic Society of Corona Norco on Sunday, April 10. Iftar is the evening meal with which Muslims end their daily Ramadan fast at sunset. To be honest, I didn't know much about Iftar and Ramadan until I attended this event. And I'm so glad I did, because it's fascinating to me that our Muslim friends observe Ramadan at the same time we Christians observe Lent. As you know, Lent is also a time many choose to experience fasting as a way to turn focus away from temptations of this world and toward God's ideal for life instead. Some people added things during Lent (more time for prayer) instead of giving something up.

I heard the "voice" of God prompting me to give up sugar for Lent. It was a difficult journey. I like a little coffee with my sugar, if you know what I mean. But I believe I experienced better health, more energy, a clearer mind and less joint pain from this experience. And I feel a little less addicted to my cravings for sugar. There were a few days I fell off the wagon, just like everyone experiences. But not only did I get back on again, which is the important part, I've also decided to cut way down on my sugar intake from now on. Wow! 40 days of trying something new DOES create new habits! Jesus provided the way for me to break this bond.

Now, in this season of Easter - which lasts until Pentecost Sunday, May 5 (more about that in another letter ()) - we celebrate the Risen Christ. In worship we sing hymns with lyrics about Jesus' resurrection, read Bible passages about Jesus' time with the disciples in his resurrected form and we light the Paschal candle. The word Paschal comes from the Hebrew word *Pesah* for Passover. For Christians, Jesus IS the Passover lamb given to set us free from sin. Basically, paschal means "deliverance". So we light this candle in worship from Easter Sunday until Pentecost as a sign of Jesus being our deliverance.

Whew! You made it to the end! This was more than you wanted to know about the season of Easter, but I pray this helps you connect tradition to your daily experience of living life alongside Christ. He is our peace and our salvation!
